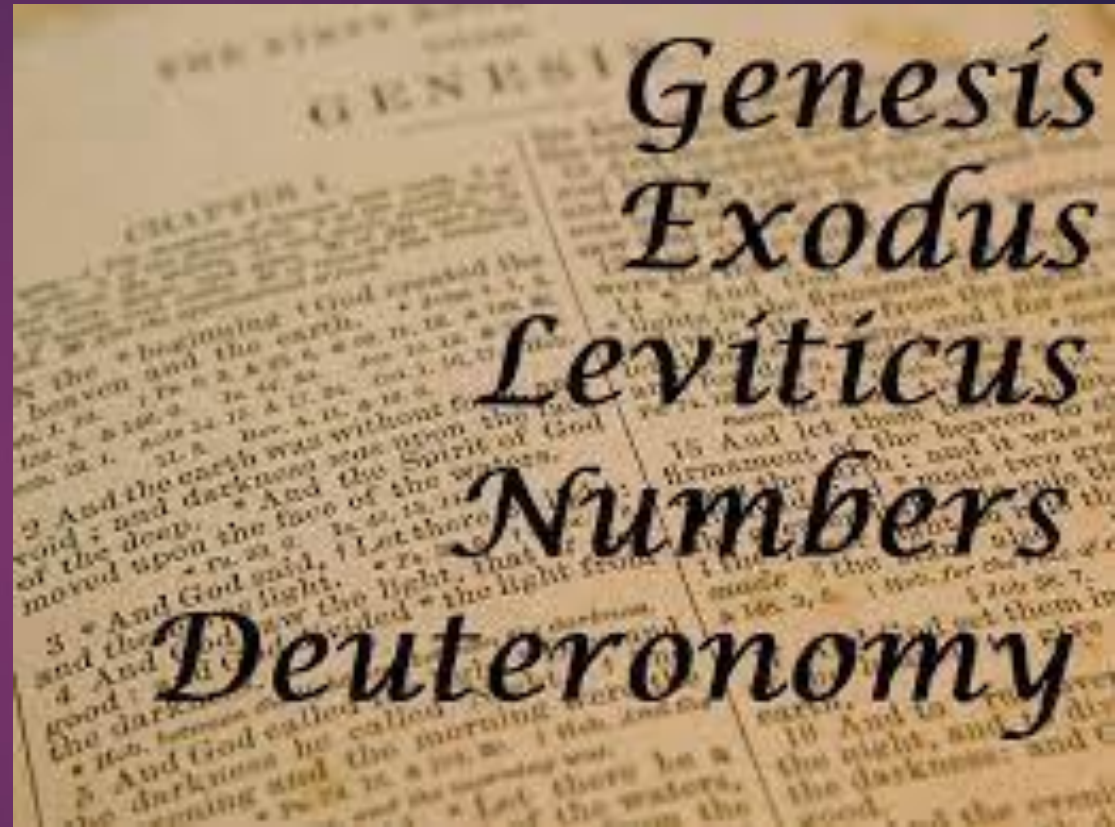

Why should we study the Bible?

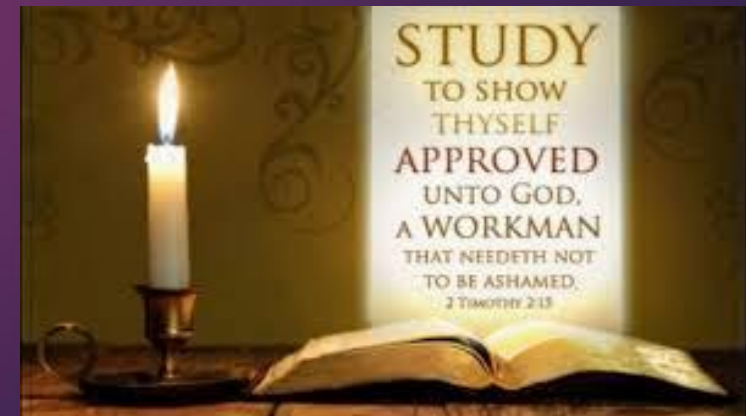
1. To recognize error



Why should we study the Bible?

2. To show ourselves approved

Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth (2 Timothy 2:15)



Why should we study the Bible?

Main Reason: To get to know the Lord!

The Bible is a book of revelation-a revealing of the Creator and Redeemer. Ultimately, we study the Bible to get to know Him!



What is the Bible?

Collection of 66 “books” written in 3 languages (Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek) by over 40 authors over a time span of around 1500 years.

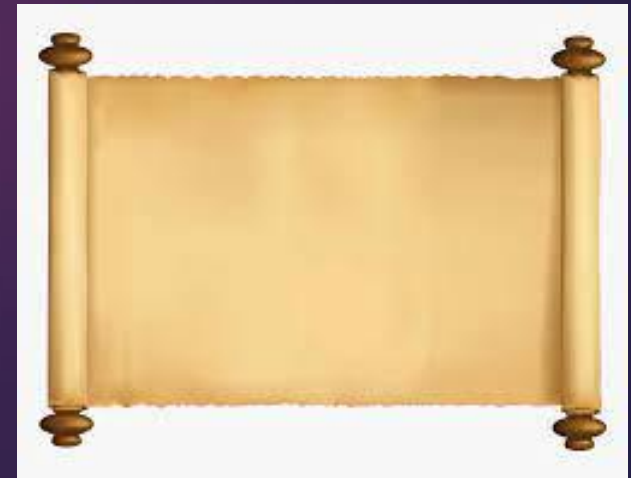

The Pentateuch

- *Pentateuch (Greek for 5 books)*
- *Torah (Hebrew for “law” or “instruction”)*
- *Cross cultural experience*
- *Shared with Jews and Muslims*



Setting:

→ Getting ready to enter the land of Canaan.

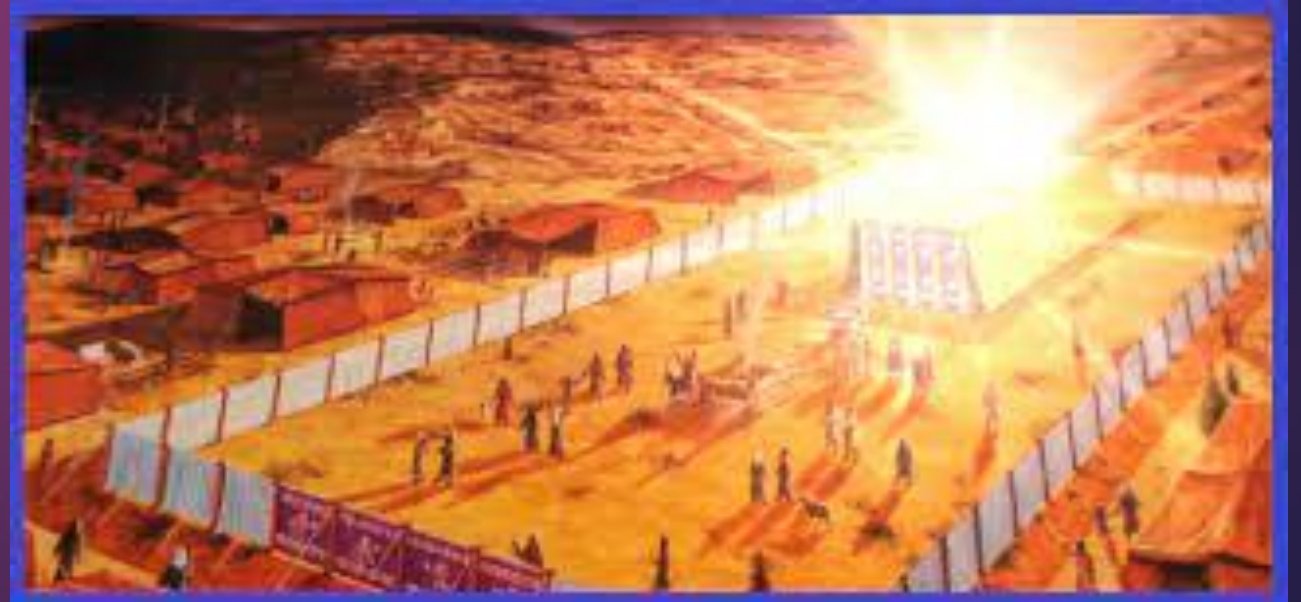
Purpose:

-To orient them to one God.

-To show His intention in creation for relationship.

-To reveal His character, standards and promise.





Author:

-For 2000 years, Moses was the undisputed author.

-Critical scholarship in 18th century cast doubt on Moses as author.

-Literary and historical evidence for Moses as author

Genesis 12-Deuteronomy 34



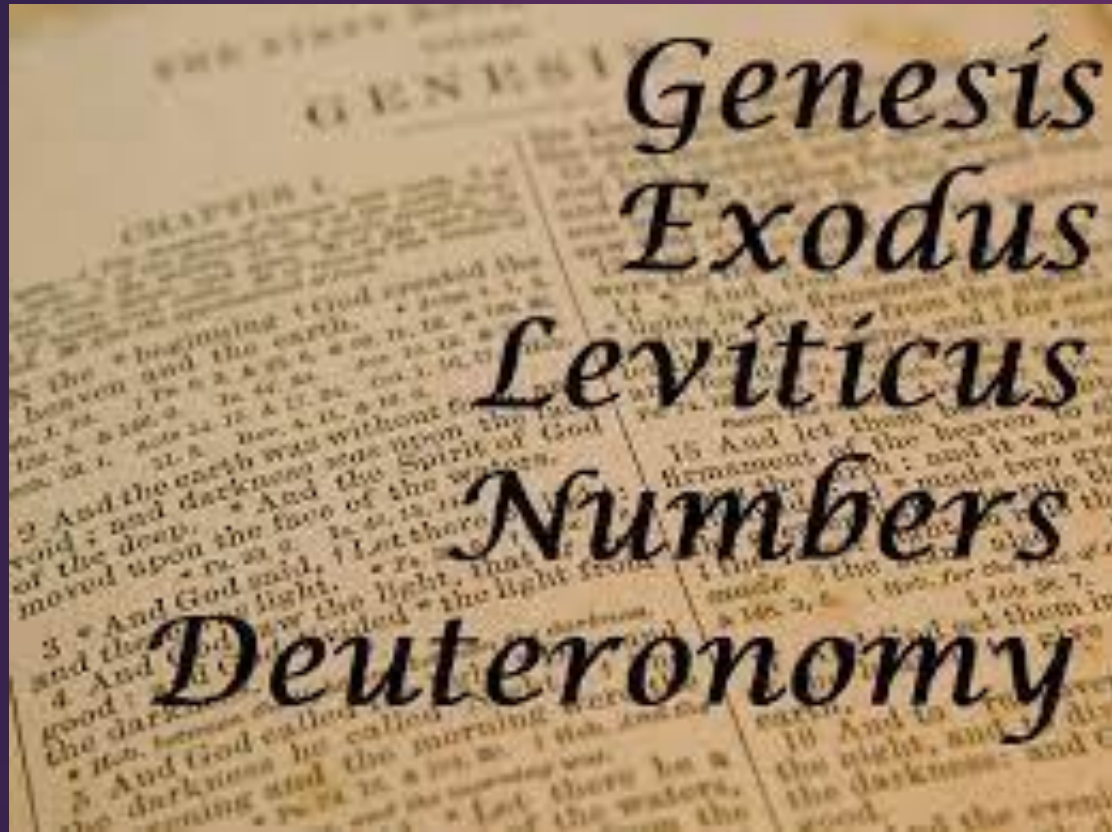
Theme: The Call and Blessing of Abraham (Genesis 12:1-3)

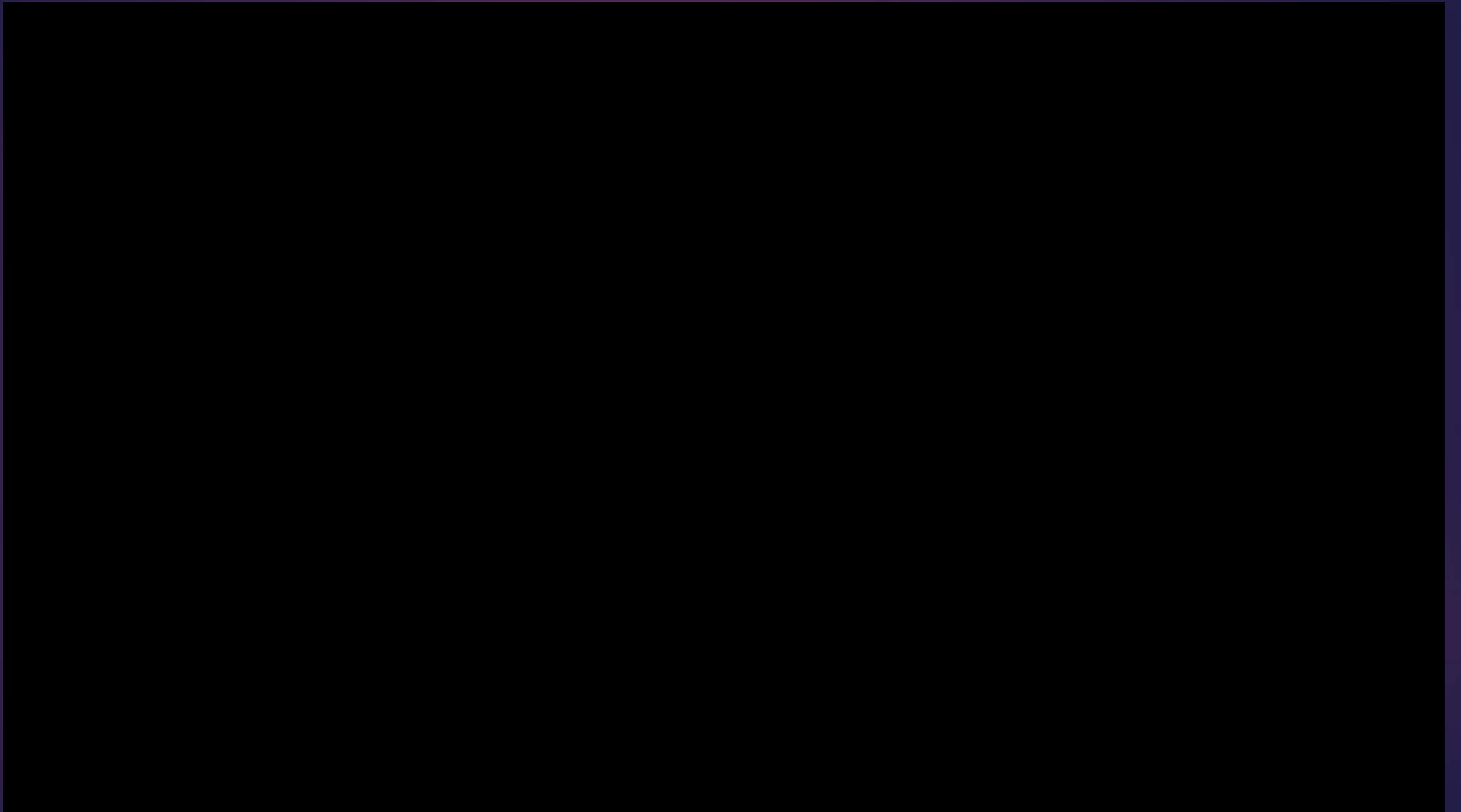

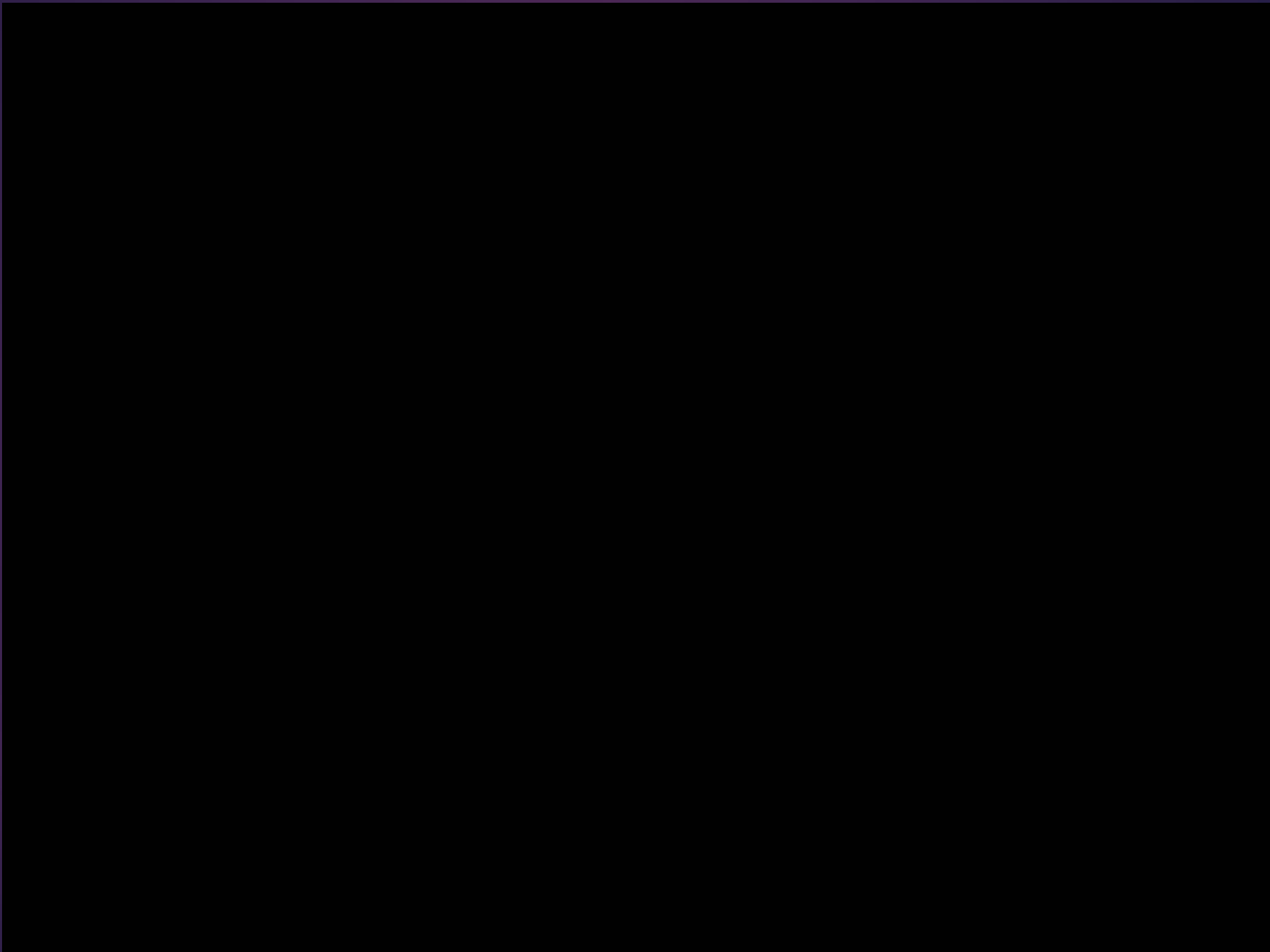
